



From the Study Guide created by Alicia Goodman:

"In popular culture, Robin Hood and his band of Merry Men are usually portrayed as living in Sherwood Forest, in Nottinghamshire, where much of the action in the early ballads takes place. Ballads are the oldest existing form of the Robin Hood legends, although none of them were recorded at the time of the first allusions to him, and many are much later. They share many common features, often opening with praise of the greenwood and relying heavily on disguise as a plot device, but include a wide variation in tone and plot. The first clear reference to "rhymes of Robin Hood" is from the late 14th-century poem Piers Plowman, but the earliest surviving copies of the narrative ballads which tell his story have been dated to the 15th century or the first decade of the 16th century."

We've all grown up with the legend of Robin Hood—whether by way of Errol Flynn, Walt Disney, Daffy Duck, Cary Elwes, or Russell Crowe. The story of the dashing hero and his merry companions, robbing from the rich to give to the poor, is ubiquitous in our entertainment culture. With this adaptation, Michelle L. Vacca has taken most of the well-known elements of the legend and fused them together to form a fast-paced romp through Sherwood and its surroundings. For these reasons, we were excited to choose this show for our season. The opportunity to play with such a clever script and wonderful story was too much to pass up.

A bonus for this production has been the involvement of so many talented children and community members outside of the Department of Theatre. Theatre is at its best when it is a truly communal event, and Robin Hood has been just that. The opportunity to share, play, grow, and learn with all of these artists has enriched my life, and the lives of our students, greatly. If you have a young person in this company, I thank you for sharing them with us for the past few weeks. Each and every one of them has been a joy to be around and a pleasure to watch grow.

And finally, accept my heartfelt thanks for joining here in the theatre. The audience is the lifeblood of what we do and your presence completes the circle for us.
